Music electives are a yearlong commitment, and may not be switched once the school year is underway. Please read the information below and make a single selection.

Choir is open to all grade 6 students regardless of experience or ability. Time in class is primarily spent exploring vocal technique through song while practicing beginning part-singing and advancing in mythm and note reading. Students sing music of varying styles from a variety of cultures. Goal setting and home practice are required asstudents prepare for performances, including a choral festival. Students are expected to partic ipate in evening performancesperiodically throughout the year, which are counted as a percentage of their grade. **STUDENTS WHO OPTTO JOIN JAZZC HOIR, WHICH MEETS BEFORE SCHOOL, ARE REQ UIRED TO ENROL IN THIS CLASS.

Band is open to all grade 6 students regardless of experience or ability. Band students will need to rent or purc hase an instrument (see instrument information on the other side of this page). Previous knowledge of music is not required. Orchestra students will need to rent or purchase an instrument (see instrument information on the other side of this page). Sixth-grade orchestra builds on the skills leamed in elementary school. More advanced music and vibrato skills are introduced. This class is not designed for beginning strings students. Students are expected to practice at home and participate in evening concerts periodically throughout the year, which are counted as a percentage of theirgrade.

## INSIRUMENTINFORMATION

- Band and Orchestra students will need to provide their own instrument. However, parents are encouraged not to rent orpurchase a band instrument before the confirmation of instrument selection which will occur during the first few days of school.
- If you have a band instrument in your fa mily, please make a note next to the instrument choice above, a nd efforts will be ma de to assist your child in playing that instrument. Plea se have the instrument checked by a qualified repair person so it will be in proper working order before school starts in the fall.
- A limited number of instruments are available for rent through the school. Band instruments are $\$ 75$ per semester and Orchestra instruments are $\$ 50$ per semester.
- Music stores also provide instrument rentals at a slightly higher rate than the school.


## GRADE 6 COURSE DESCRIPIONS

2021-2022

ENGUSH/ பTERATURE: Sixth-grade reading incorporates the district-adopted literature textbook with a variety of novels a nd poetry. Activities are used to strengthen reading skills. The basics of formal research will be introduced. The class also works with grammar, sentence structure, spelling and essay formats.

## MATHEMATICS OPIIONS:

- MATH 6: In line with the Common Core State Standards, instructional time focuses on four critic al areas: (1) connecting ratio and rate to whole number multiplic ation and division and using concepts of ratio and rate to solve problems; (2) completing understanding of division of fractions and extending the notion of number to the system of rational numbers, which includes negative numbers; (3) writing, interpreting, and using expressions and equations; and (4) developing understanding of statistical thinking.
- MATH 6/7: This c lass is offered to qualifying grade 6 math students using assessment data collected in grade 5, along with teac her input. In line with the Common Core State Standards, this c ourse addresses the following topics: (1) developing understanding of and applying proportional relationships; (2) developing understanding of operations with rational numbers and working with expressionsand linear equations; (3) solving problems involving scale dra wings and informal geometric constructions, and working with two and three dimensional shapes to solve problemsinvolving area, surface area, and volume; and (4) dra wing inferences about populations based on samples.

SOCIALSTUDIES This course is designed to lay the foundations for understanding the development of soc ieties and civilizations from early human social groupingsto more advanced societies and the rise of first empires. As such, students will be exposed to, a nd become familiar with, different people, places, and cultures from a round the world. Early civilizations, cultures and geography are studied from Meso-Americ a to pre-Mesopotamia, ancient Egypt, Greece, and Rome.

SCIENCE Sixth Grade Science covers physic al science topic sincluding light \& matter and themal energy. Earth science topics include weather systems, plate tec tonic s\& rock cycling, a nd natural hazards. Life science topic sinclude cells \& cell systems. We take a phenomenon-based approach to discovering more about each topic and practice "being a scientist" by utilizing scientific practicesthroughout the year. These are all aligned with Next Generation Science Standards as adopted by Washington State.

CHOIR Sixth grade choir is open to all students regardless of experience or ability. Time in c lass is prima rily spent exploring vocal tec hnique through song while practicing beginning part-singing a nd advancing in ryythm and note reading. Students sing music of varying styles from a variety of cultures. Goal setting and home practice are required as students prepare for performances, including a choral festival. Students are expected to participate in evening performances periodically throughout the year, which are counted as a percentage of their grade. **STUDENTS WHO OPTTO J OIN JAZZCHOIR, WHICH MEETS BEFORE SCHOOL, ARE REQUIRED TO ENRO $\amalg$ IN THIS CLASS.

GRADE 6 BEGINNING BAND Beginning band is open to all sixth grade students and is designed for students who want to leam how to play an instrument that is a part of the modem wind band ensemble (see list below). The majority of the time spent in sixth-grade band is dedicated to leaming how to play a musical instrument with emphasis on technique, music theory and music history. This ensemble will perform on at least two concerts throughout the school year. A previous knowledge of music is not required. Band instruments from which to choose: Flute, Oboe, Bassoon, Clarinet, Bass Cla rinet, Alto Saxophone, Tenor Saxophone, Baritone Saxophone, Trumpet (orComet), French Hom, Trombone, Baritone (or Euphonium), Tuba, Bells, (bell kit required) (limit 8). School rentals are offered on a first-come first-served basis for $\$ 75$ per semester.

ORCHESTRA Sixth-grade orchestra builds on the skillsleamed in elementary school. More advanced music and vibrato skills are introduced. This class is not designed for beginning stringsstudents. Home practice will be required as a portion of their grade. Students who are currently enrolled in the elementary strings program are encouraged to continue in orchestra. A limited number of instruments a re a vailable through the school. School rental fees per semester are $\$ 50$ for violins, violas, a nd cellos. Music stores also have renta ls for a slightly higher rate.

FINESS, MOVEMENT, SPORT \& HEALTH (RMSH) - FMSH is ta ught in conjunction with Art. Three quarters of the year will be spent in FMSH, a nd a single quarter in Art. The purpose of Fitness, Movement, Sport and Health at Lincoln Middle School is to create a safe environment for students to take positive risks, experience a variety of activities that promote healthy a nd fit lifestyles and understand the benefit of purposeful movement. Students will a lso leam accurate health information that encourages positive life choices and influences, and demonstrate growth in their knowledge, understanding, and applic ation of the Washington State Physic al Education and Health Educ ation Standards and important concepts.

ARTPUNDAMENTALS - Art is taught in conjunction with FMSH. One quarter of the year will be spent in Art. In this course, students will be introduced to a variety of mediums and techniques to leam about the elements and principles of art. Students will also be exposed to art development across cultures and history, and explore how these contexts relate to their own work. Students will work in both 2D and 3D media, with an emphasis on exploration, c reativity and understanding of basic concepts. Drawing, painting, ceramics and papier-mâché will be among the media explored throughout the quarter.
